### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I am pleased to report to you that the efforts of your association and particularly the Executive Committee and the Officers have produced positive results in the improvement of Justice in Broward County.

At the request of the Clerk of the Circuit Court, the Executive Committee resolved to support the Clerk's application to the County Commission for 27 additional positions. I met with the Clerk and the Commission Budget Officer. I personally appeared before the Commission on January 26, and on February 16 in support of the Clerk. The Commission approved 11 of the 27 positions. They will be hired promptly.

Your Executive Committee resolved to support the appointment of a Broward County Nominee to the vacancy on the Fourth District Court of Appeal. The vacancy was a Broward Seat and the appointment from another county would have left us with only one of the eight District Court of Appeal Judges from Broward. Along with Judge Weissing, I met with Governor Graham's Legal Counsel and his appointments secretary to support your association's position. Judge James H. Walden received the appointment on Friday, February 19, 1982. Judge Walden stated to me "the position of the Broward County Bar Association and the support of its officers and members in contacting Governor Graham were significant factors in my obtaining the appointment."

On February 8, 1982, Judge Weissing and I appeared before the House Judiciary Committee to support our request for additional Judges in Broward County. As a result of this meeting and additional information gathered and submitted, the Legislation providing two additional Circuit Judges and two additional County Judges for Broward County was reported favorable to the House on February 10, 1982. At our February 18th meeting a further resolution was adopted and action was authorized to move this bill through the Senate and the Appropriations Committees. Special thanks are due to the Broward Lawyer members of the House Judiciary Committee who personally attended the Hearing: Tom Bush, Terry O'Malley and Larry Smith.

What has been accomplished shows what can be done if we work together and act promptly.

We need your help to complete the task of moving the Legislation for our additional Judges through the Legislative process.



# ESTATE AND GIFT TAX ASPECTS OF THE ECONOMIC RECOVERY TAX ACT OF 1981

(Note: This article is the first in a series on the Estate and Gift Tax Aspects of the Economic Recovery Act of 1981 (ERTA) which will be presented by the Probate and Trust Law Section of the Broward County Bar Association. This article was prepared by Theodore H. Fulton, Jr., on behalf of W. Lawrence Larche, Chairman.)

This article will cover two principle areas of change in the estate and gift tax provisions of the Internal Revenue Code:

- I. Reduction in Maximum Estate and Gift Tax Rates
- II. Gifts within Three Years of Death
- I. Reduction in Maximum Estate and Gift Tax Rates

Under prior law for taxable transfers after January 1, 1981, the rates ranged from 32%, for initial amounts not covered by the \$47,000 unified credit (or the exemption equivalent of \$175,625), to 70% on transfers in which the aggregate amounts transfered exceeded \$5,000,000. Under ERTA, beginning January 1, 1982, the top 70% bracket is reduced in 5% increments, annually, over a four year period to a new maximum 50% rate when the reduction is fully phased in in 1985:

(See Code \$2001(c) as amended by Act \$402(b))

In computing estate taxes, a tentative tax is determined based on the decedent's taxable estate and the decedent's adjusted taxable gifts. A tentative tax is then reduced by the amount of gift taxes payable on post-1976 gifts. In order to prevent the reduced maximum tax rates from having a retroactive effect, the reduction by the amount of gift taxes paid is determined by the rate schedule in effect in the year in which the decedent dies, rather than the year the gift was made (Code \$2001 (b)(2) as amended by Act \$402(c)); in other words, the tax on a post-1976 gift that was subject to tax at the highest (70%) rate at the time of the gift, would be subject to the maximum tax in effect in the year of death of the decedent in computing the deduction for gift taxes payable (i.e., 65% in 1982, .60% in 1983, etc.).

When the increase in the unified credit and the reduction in maximum rates are both completely phased in, the initial taxable rate (after application of

the unified credit against estate tax) will be 37% and the maximum rate 50%. For estate planning purposes, this relatively small incremental difference will warrant consideration of postponing the payment of taxes in many intraspousal situations in order to take advantage of the earning capacity of the funds that would otherwise be lost by prematurely paying taxes.

II. Gifts within Three Years of Death Under previous law, gifts made by a decedent within three years of death were brought back into the decedent's gross estate for federal estate tax purposes. ERTA changed this and, with certain exceptions, excludes gifts made within three years of the decedent's death from inclusion in the decedent's estate: the exceptions that are still included are interests in property covered by Code \$2036, \$2037, \$2038 and \$2042 relating to transfers taking effect at death, revocable transfers, powers of appointment, and life insurance proceeds, or interests in property which would have been included under any of these sections if such interest had been re-

The effect of excluding gifts made within three years of death is to exclude post-gift appreciation from inclusion in the decedent's estate. Therefore, post-gift appreciation (with the exception of the items covered by \$2036, \$2037, \$2038 and \$2042) will not be subject to transfer taxes. Because this potential appreciation is no longer includable in the decedent's gross estate, there will not be any step-up in basis for appreciated property as had preiously been the case for post-1976 gifts made within three years of the decedent's death and not covered by the annual gift tax exclusion.

There are four situations where the three year rule will still apply, the first three of which could have favorable effects on the decedent's estate:

- 1. In determining the values of stock in a decedent's estate for purposes of qualifying for a \$303 redemption (for redemption of stock to pay death taxes);
- 2. For purposes of a \$2032A determination with respect to election of special use valuation of farms and closelyheld business real property.
- 3. In determination of extensions and provisions for payment of taxes under Code \$6166 where a substantial portion of the estate is concentrated in a a closely-held business; and
- 4. For purposes of determination of property subject to estate tax liens.

Uneffected by ERTA is the rule that gift taxes paid after 1976, during the period three years prior to a decedent's death, are brought back into the estate to "gross-up" the estate and are therefore taxable.




