FILING FEES — SEVENTEENTH JUDICIAL CIRCUIT CIVIL DIVISION

Pursuant to Florida Statutes 28.241(1) as amended, effective OCTOBER 1, 1982, the clerk shall charge an additional service charge of \$1.00 for each civil suit presented for filing. The service charge collected shall be deposited in the Court Education Trust Fund.

PROCEDURES AND FEE SCHEDULE FOR MONROE COUNTY, FLORIDA

Effective October 1, 1982, payment for cost must be made in the exact amount, only, in the form of a check made payable to WILLIAM A. FREEMAN, JR., SHERIFF of Monroe County. Any payment received that is not the correct amount will be returned to the sender along with the unserved process. Also, excess funds to be used as the need arises will no longer be maintained. Payment for each document must accompany each document when it is submitted.

The following represents a clarification of the new fee schedule:

Docketing and Indexing each writ of Execution regardless of the number of persons involved	\$10.00
Each Levy	\$10.00
Advertisement of sale under process	\$ 5.00
Sale under process	\$ 5.00
Deed or Bill of Sale	\$ 5.00

Advanced cash required for Writs of Execution shall remain unchanged. No additional fees shall be required for alias and pluries documents when service was not effected on the original document.

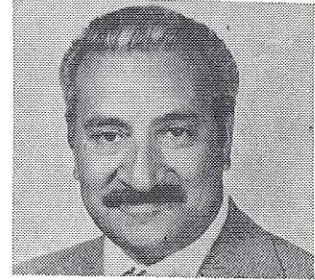

"Broward Lawyers Care" is a program established by the Broward County Bar Association to help provide legal services to the indigent residents of Broward County. The success of the program can only be measured by the number of lawyers who participate. The urgent need is for attorneys who are willing to provide representation in the domestic relations area. It is now estimated that by December, all current volunteers will have been referred their full limit of cases.
