(c) As a means of accomplishing its educational and charitable purposes hereof, and subject to the restrictions expressed in subparagraphs (a), (b) and (c) of this ARTICLE II, the Corporation shall have any and all powers as may be expressly or impliedly permitted as to corporations not for profit set forth in Chapter 617 of the Florida Statutes or subsequently enacted comparable Statute or Statutes."

In the 1981-82 Bar year, the Foundation undertook its first significant project. This was the sponsorship of monthly judicial luncheons, first for the Criminal Division and later for the Civil Division of the Circuit Court. These luncheons provided the opportunity for the judges to gather in a relaxed atmosphere and discuss their mutual problems and concerns. This project was funded by contribu-

tions from two law firms.

Approximately five other contributions were received from other lawyers during the first two years of its existence. In 1981, the Internal Revenue Service determined that the Foundation qualified as a tax exempt charitable organiza-

tion under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

In the early fall of 1982, Foundation Tax Counsel, Jim Davis, advised that the Foundation should take two steps to maintain its tax exempt status. First, it should revise its Board of Trustees so that a majority were members of the Bar other than members of the Broward County Bar Association Executive Committee and, second, it should broaden its contribution base as to number and amount.

The first step was accomplished in September of 1982. The Board of Trus-

Secretary-Treasurer Angeline G. Weir The Foundation will continue the judges' luncheon program provided sufficient contributions can be obtained. Law firm contributions, memorial gifts, and donations from excess campaign funds from judicial candidates are anticipated.

The firm of Patterson and Maloney initiated the scholarship fund with a donation of \$750.00 to be used for a law student at Nova University. Contributions may be for the general use of the Foundation or may be earmarked for any of the specific charitable purposes of the Foundation such as scholarships for law students.

At its November 10th meeting, the Board of Trustees voted to explore the use of the Foundation as a vehicle for donations from lawyers and legal organizations for a new Bar building. The Ways and Means Committee will report on the legal and tax ramifications at the next meeting of the Board of Trustees.


