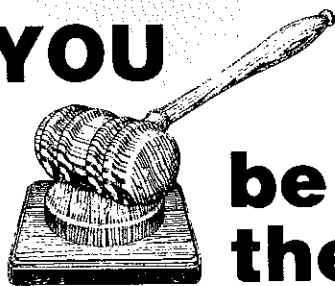

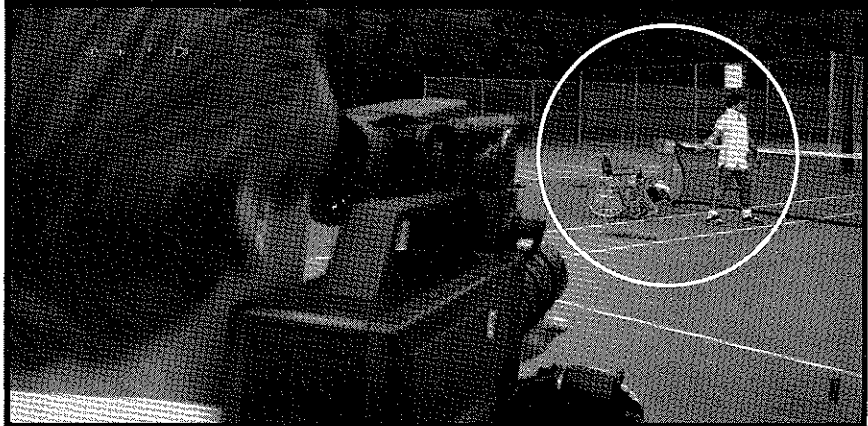

Attorneys Alert!

Certain Deposit Receipt and Contract for Sale and Purchase have been used in Broward County lately which have adopted the basic format of the contract approved by the Broward County Bar Association and the Fort Lauderdale Area Board of Realtors. Numerous changes have been made in the Standards for Real Estate Transactions, which could be extremely detrimental to a seller. Attorneys should be cautious to be sure that the contract form that they are using contains the provision at the bottom of the contract: "The form of this 'Deposit Receipt and Contract for Sale and Purchase' has been approved by the Broward County Bar Association and the Fort Lauderdale Area Board of Realtors, Inc." This provision appears on all of the contracts for the Bar Association and the Board of Realtors, however, to date has not appeared on any of the similar contracts which we have seen.

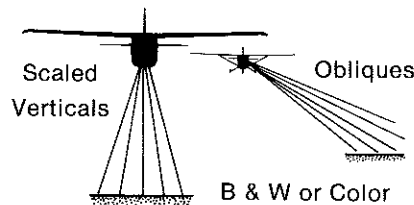

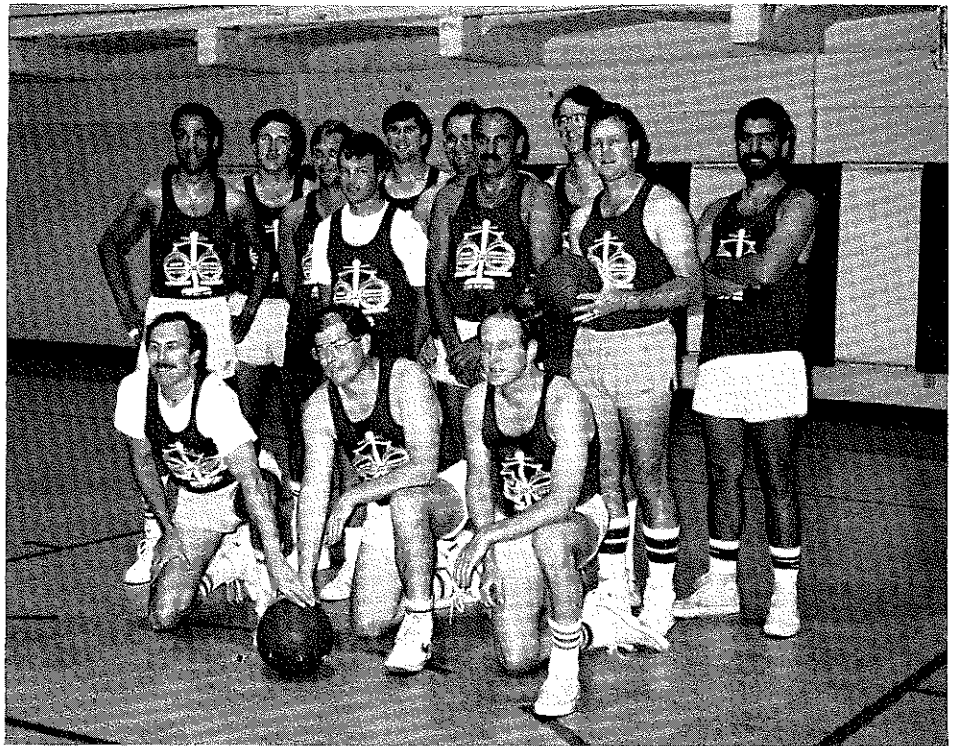

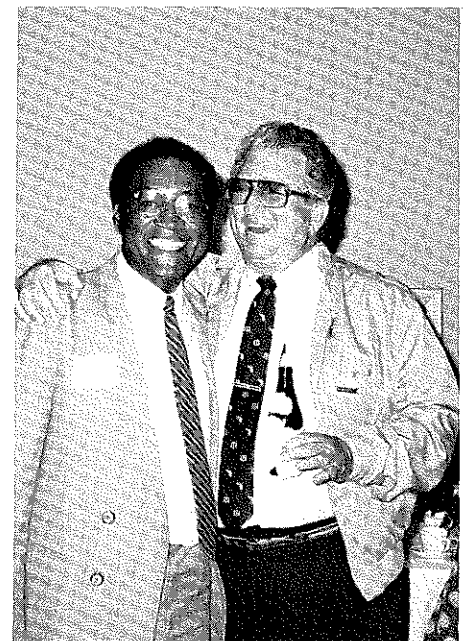
