Judge Stacy Ross, Circuit Judge.

Judge Stacy Ross was born and raised in Broward County. She graduated from the University of Florida and obtained her law degree from Nova Southeastern University. Her passion for public service began in law school as she graduated with Pro Bono Service Honors. Judge Ross is a circuit court judge, currently serving in the Juvenile Division. Prior, Judge Ross served as a county court judge in both the criminal and civil divisions. Before taking the bench, Judge Ross was an Assistant State Attorney for the 17th Judicial Circuit. There, she gained extensive trial experience, trying capital sexual battery and murder cases.
